

SPAXTON'S DEFIBRILLATOR

The first steps have been made towards getting a defibrillator for Spaxton. This would be close to the hall, stores and the sports fields where it is most likely to be required. Advice has been obtained from the Community Heartbeat Trust, a charity which promotes defibrillators and leads groups through the setting-up process. Community Heartbeat summarises the benefits;

The Government has set a target for ambulance trusts all over the UK to reach 75% of life threatening calls within 8 minutes. Statistics show that early defibrillation can increase the survival chances of a person who has suffered a sudden cardiac arrest by as much as 50%. The Government's 8 minute target is easier to achieve in towns and cities. However the situation is different in rural village locations. In these situations access to emergency defibrillation equipment for use by the public can make the difference between life and death, increasing survival post Cardiac Arrest towards 50%.

In the UK approximately 200 people per day suffer sudden cardiac arrest. Statistics show that for every minute that passes, the chances of survival decrease by 23%. Clinical evidence suggests that this figure is actually higher in rural locations.
